But they had no children because Elizabeth was barren, and both were getting on in years. Once when he was serving as priest

before God during his section's turn of duty, he was chosen by lot, according to the custom of the priesthood, to enter the sanctuary of the Lord to offer incense. Now at the time of the incense offering, the whole assembly of the people was praying outside. Then there appeared to him an angel of the Lord, standing at the right side of the altar of incense. When Zechariah saw him, he was terrified, and fear overwhelmed him. But the angel said to him, "Do not be afraid, Zechariah, for your prayer has been heard. Your wife Elizabeth will bear you a son, and you will name him John.

We pray for those who lie in hospital beds, desperate for good news.

We pray for those who cannot put food on the table and wonder how they'll keep the lights on. We pray for children that feel overlooked, and for adults that feel heartbreakingly alone.

Holy One, we ask for peace in a world of conflict - we send our prayers to the Middle East, to Ukraine, Sudan and Haiti.

God, the hurt and longing in this world is enough to leave us speechless.

So just as you did for Zechariah, speak to us.

Remind us that we are not alone and that our prayers have been heard.

And as you do, and as we wait, we will join our voices together to pray the prayer your son taught us to pray, saying,

Our Mother and Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth, as it is in heaven.

Give us this day our daily bread, And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil:

For thine is the kingdom, the power, and the glory forever and ever. Amen.
